Re:- To take immediate action against Adamas University's School of Health and Medical Sciences having office at - Barasat - Barrackpore Road, Jagannathpur, Kolkata, West Bengal 700126, for Improper Disposal of Bio-Medical Waste.

Sir's/Madam's,

I am writing to formally bring to your attention a serious issue concerning the improper disposal of bio-medical waste by Adamas University's School of Health and Medical Sciences, located at Barasat - Barrackpore Road, Jagannathpur, Kolkata, West Bengal 700126. The hospital has been routinely discarding medical waste, including used syringes, bandages, gloves, and other hazardous materials, in open areas near residential premises and they are also disposing those medical waste in my land as I am the adjacent landowner and I am also residing at the said place and the said Adamas University's School of Health and Medical Sciences instead of following the prescribed bio-medical waste management protocols.

This careless handling of infectious and toxic waste is causing severe environmental and health concerns in our locality. The foul smell, increased presence of stray animals, and the potential spread of infectious diseases have made it difficult for residents to live safely and comfortably. Despite repeated verbal complaints to the hospital management, no corrective measures have been taken so far.

I kindly request your office to initiate an immediate inspection of the hospital's waste management practices and take strict action in accordance with the *Bio-Medical Waste Management Rules, 2016*, and other relevant public health regulations. Prompt intervention is essential to protect the health and well-being of the residents in this area.

I hope that necessary steps will be taken at the earliest to ensure compliance and to prevent any further harm to the community and the environment.
