I submit that the Greater Chennai Corporation formerly known as the Corporation of Madras is the civic body that governs the city of Chennai, Tamil Nadu and one of the oldest corporation inaugurated on 29 September, 1688. The extent of the city is 426 Sq.Km and is classified into three regions: North region, Central region and South region. It is further divided into 15 Zones consisting of 200 Wards

**1. Door to Door Collection of waste - 54%**

- As per 2011 census, population of Greater Chennai Corporation was 46,46,732 before delimitation. The Projected population is 85,17,653. The present projected population of Greater Chennai Corporation as on 2025 is 94, 01,539. The floating population of Greater Chennai Corporation is estimated as 10% of the total population.
- At present, for Primary collection and secondary transportation, Greater Chennai Corporation operates 5966 battery-operated vehicles (BOVs), 309 HMTV/LMTV compactors,

200 HMV/LMV tippers, 62 mechanical sweepers in all 1-15 Zones.

- Per capita generation of garbage is 689 gms /day. Total quantity of Municipal Solid Waste collected is 5790 TPD (Avg April 2025). In total collection, Wet waste quantity is 3011 TPD. Dry waste quantity is 2316 TPD and 463 TPD of Inert waste. In that 2665 TPD of waste is dumped in Kodungaiyur dumping yard and 2324 TPD of waste is dumped in Perungudi dumping yard and remaining 801 TPD of waste is processed in decentralized processing units.
- Currently 22, 33,730 No's of Household are covered through door to door collection and 5966 No's battery-operated vehicles are deployed for this operation. A battery-operated vehicle covers approximately 450 Household per day.
- The field assessment of Swachh Survekshan 2024 was carried out during the month of April 2025 for ranking of city at various locations in Greater Chennai Corporation.

- During the month April 2025, the average of 4649 No's battery-operated vehicle was deployed covering the average of 20,92,065 No's Household for door to door collection of waste.
- As per Solid Waste Management bye law, 2019 Penalties and spot fines are being levied for violation of SWM Rules. The total amount fine collected for violating SWM rules is Rs.2,716,650.
- Greater Chennai Corporation has achieved 93 % of door to door collection of waste in month of April 2025 as per the reviews by higher ups with data and GCC is taking all measures to improve Door to Door Collection of waste.

## **2. Source Segregation – 36%**

- For implementation of source segregation the Greater Chennai Corporation is creating various awareness campaigns through IEC continuously and for each division has one animator through Swachh Bharat Mission specifically to carry out Door to Door Collection and Source Segregation awareness above 2500 program was conducted to the general public to achieve 100% source segregation.
- The Conservancy operations are out sourced for 13 Zones out of 15 Zones namely Urbaser Sumeet and M/s Chennai Enviro Private limited (Ramky). The source segregation and collection of waste from door step were included as part of a key performance indicators which results in payment mechanism. The non privatized two Zones, where in Greater Chennai Corporation collects solid waste and progressing towards it.

- Total quantity of waste collected is about 5790 TPD. Wet waste quantity is 3011TPD. Dry waste quantity is 2316 TPD and 463 TPD of Inert waste. In that 2665 TPD of waste is dumped in Kodungaiyur dumping yard and 2324 TPD of waste is dumped in Perungudi dumping yard and remaining 801 TPD of waste is processed in decentralized processing units.
- In that wet waste processing facilities has the capacity of 575 TPD and dry waste processing facilities has the capacity 230 TPD for processing of waste.
- Currently Greater Chennai Corporation has achieved 36% of source segregation of waste and GCC is taking all measures to improve source segregation.

### **3. Waste generation vs processing - 21%**

- Total quantity of waste collected is about 5790 TPD. Wet waste quantity is 3011TPD. Dry waste quantity is 2316 TPD and 463 TPD of Inert waste.
- In that 2665 TPD of waste is dumped in Kodungaiyur and 2324 TPD of waste is dumped in Perungudi dumping yard and remaining 801TPD of waste is processed in decentralized processing units.
- At present the GCC has decentralized wet waste processing units such as Micro composting, Garden waste and tender coconut shell processing, windrow composting, BIO CNG plants etc. having capacity of around 576 TPD.

- The Greater Chennai Corporation has operated 190 Micro Compost Centers (MCCs) and 137 Material Recovery Centers/ Resource Recovery Centers across Zones 1 to 15 as on 01.01.2025. However, due to following issues brought to the attention, required immediate action from GCC end.

- The Public Objection: Residents in areas close to MCCs & MRF/RRC have raised concerns about foul odors emanating from the waste, affecting public health. These objections have been supported by elected representatives, who have requested to close such MCCs & MRF/RRCs.
- The MCCs & MRF/RRCs Located in Burial Grounds: 58 No's of MCCs and 40 Nos. of MRF/RRCs are located in burial grounds, which have drawn strong opposition from elected representatives, NGOs, the public, and Residents Welfare Associations (RWAs). They emphasise the need to maintain the sanctity of these locations, as they are used for rituals and ceremonies to honor departed souls.
- The sensitive nature of such activities and the cultural importance of maintaining the sanctity of the Burial ground. It is imperative that the MCCs & MRF/RRCs were removed from the burial ground.
- The Greater Chennai Corporation has finalized a list of MCCs & MRF/RRCs that are operational, well-maintained, and do not pose any public concerns. Out of the existing 190 MCCs, 22 have been evaluated & out of the existing 137 MRF/RRCs, 49 have been evaluated and the remaining MCCs & MRF/RRCs are identified for closure and the same was approved by council resolution vide No.70 dt:27.02.2025.

- Greater Chennai Corporation has the Action plan for the future to implement an integrated waste Management plan that includes Bio-CNG Plant, Compost Plant, Automated MRF & Waste to Energy plant at Kodungaiyur (North Chennai) and Perungudi (South Chennai).

- A part from these as per the 2025 – 2026 Mayor Announcement GCC planning to establish 100 MT Windrow compost & 100 MT Baling plant. For 100 MT Windrow Plant at Perungudi preliminary works are under progress, planning to commence in the financial year 2025 – 2026 and for 100 MT Mega Baling plant Administrative sanction awaited.
- Greater Chennai Corporation has taken proactive steps for the management of waste in the city. The proposed processing plants from GCC will reduce the dumping of solid waste in the Dump yards.

#### **4. Remediation of Dumpsites – 33%**

- In Greater Chennai Corporation the proposal of reclamation of Perungudi and Kodungaiyur landfill site through Bio-mining technology is taken up in compliance to the SWM Rules, 2016.

- Perungudi Dump site is located in the southern part of the city, spread over an area of 225.16 acre. Solid waste from zones 9 to 15 is sent to the Perungudi dump site.
- The total quantity of legacy waste at Perungudi dumping yard is around 29, 28,398 cubic meter.
- As on 07.09.2025 28,29,127 cubic meter of legacy waste is processed and 24,07,271 m<sup>3</sup> of Recovered fraction is disposed.

- The Bio-mining project of Perungudi Dump site is expected to be completed by December 2025.
- The proposed Biomining site at Kodungaiyur Dumping Ground has an extent of about 342.91 acres and out of 342.91 acres, around 252.00 acres is covered with legacy waste.
- The Kodungaiyur Dumping Ground is operational since early 1980s and receives waste from zone 1 to 8.
- The total quantity of legacy waste at Kodungaiyur dumping yard is 66, 52,505 MT.
- As on 08.09.2025 so far 19,02,077.56 MT of legacy waste is processed and 10,47,957 MT of Refuse-Derived Fuel is disposed.

- Currently, Greater Chennai Corporation has achieved 97% of legacy waste in Perungudi dumping yard and 29% of legacy waste in Kodungaiyur dumping yard.

#### **5. Cleanliness of Residential Areas – 83%**

- Compliance of SWM Rules, 2016 by Bulk Waste Generators is practiced by most of the commercial Bulk Waste Generators.
- In Greater Chennai Corporation 1531 BWG's are enumerated in the GCC Mobile app.
- GCC has framed SWM Bye Laws and published in District Gazette which includes user charges for waste collection and transportation as per SWM Rules, 2016. Penalties and spot fines are being levied for violation of SWM Rules. The fine collected for violating against the SWM rules for April 2025

Rs. 23,97,900 garbage fine has been imposed, R.s 5,36,000 debris fine imposed & R.s 3,18,750 BWG fine amount has been imposed.

- GCC has strengthened grievance redressal mechanism through the official channels like the Namma Chennai app, Swachhata App, PGR complaints and also through voice call of 1913.
- GCC has identified and eliminate 686 no's of Garbage Vulnerable Points (GVPs) through ward-level mapping.
- 15 no's of IEC awareness is carried out for beautification of identified hot spots with plants, wall arts for April 2025.
- Installation of CCTV cameras around the chronic waste dump area and the violator impose with spot fines as per the Solid Waste Management Bye law - 2019.

#### **6. Cleanliness of Market Areas – 90%**

- Ban on one time single use of plastic is notified & enforced.
- The Greater Chennai Corporation has been continuously organizing various awareness programs regarding the harmful effects of using single use plastics and usage of alternate materials in schools, colleges, market areas and places of worship, malls, traders, and Residential welfare associations etc., with the coordination of Health dept officials, SBM Supervisors & Animators across the Chennai city.

- In addition, Priceless Cloth bags have been distributed to school and college students.
- Greater Chennai Corporation with the coordination of Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board, 49 Manjappai Vending Machines have been installed in public places across Chennai city including markets, to encourage citizens to adopt eco-friendly alternatives. Further, it is proposed to install 300 Manjappai vending machines in bus stand, commercial areas and markets with the co-ordination of Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board.
- GCC is conducting various IEC awareness drives in coordination with market associations.

- GCC has achieved 95% of sweeping of Market Areas and public places.
- The violators imposed with spot fines as per the Solid Waste Management Bye law - 2019.
- GCC has install Twin bin in market area for collection of generated wet and dry separately.

#### **7. Cleanliness of Water Bodies – 70%**

- Installation of 75 no's of CCTV cameras around the waste dump area point and the violators imposed with spot fines as per the Solid Waste Management Bye law - 2019.
- GCC has identified and eliminate Garbage Vulnerable Points (GVPs) through ward-level mapping.
- Illegal dumping of garbage is monitored regularly and violators are imposing with fine as per the Solid Waste Management Bye law - 2019. As of now R.s 1,66,200 fine amount has been imposed violators for illegal dumping Adyar, coom & Buckingham Canal.

#### **8. Cleanliness Of Public Toilets – 33%**

- IEC campaigns are conducted day today, like display of posters, street plays and announcements on hygiene toilets usage and menstrual hygiene practices.

- Citizen feedback mechanism setup through the official channels like the Namma Chennai app, Swachhata App, PGR complaints and also through voice call of 1913.
- Various IEC message like posters, banners and wall paintings are displayed in all toilet for hygiene and user discipline and Helpline numbers displayed for quick complaint registration.

I submit that it is therefore prayed that this Hon'ble National Green Tribunal may be pleased to consider the above facts and pass suitable orders and thus render justice.





## SUP REPORT

1. The Greater Chennai Corporation comprises of 15 zones and 200 Divisions. The Greater Chennai Corporation has intensified the drive against banned plastics. At the Zonal level the teams are headed by the Zonal health officers and at the divisional level the teams are headed by the Divisional Sanitary Inspectors. These teams regularly inspect the shops and check for the banned plastics. If banned plastics are found, the traders are fined, and plastic materials are seized. Fined Rs.8, 64, 33,688/- from the period of 01.01.2019 to 08.09.2025.

2. The Greater Chennai Corporation has been continuously organizing various awareness programs regarding the harmful effects of using single use plastics and usage of alternate materials in schools, colleges, market areas and places of worship, malls, traders, and Residential welfare associations etc., with the coordination of Health dept officials, SBM Supervisors & Animators across the Chennai city.

In addition, Priceless Cloth bags have been distributed to school and college students, markets (for consumers), after sensitizing them about the harmful effects of usage of single use plastic. More than one lakh cloth bags have been distributed so far with the coordination of NGO's, Public & Private sector companies.

3. Greater Chennai Corporation with the coordination of Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board, 49 Manjappai Vending Machines have been installed in public places across Chennai city including markets, to encourage citizens to adopt eco-friendly alternatives. This initiative has been well received by the public across Chennai. These installed machines have received tremendous public support as they were offering an affordable and convenient alternative to plastic bags.

Further, it is proposed to install 300 Manjappai vending machines in bus stand, commercial areas and markets with the co-ordination of Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board.
