In re: News item appearing in The Tribune dated 03.10.2023 titled "Faridabad residents see red over inefficient waste disposal"

REPORT ON BEHALF OF SANDEEP SINGH, REGIONAL OFFICER, HARYANA STATE POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD, FARIDABAD

MOST RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

1. That after taking note of news item published in the newspaper 'the Tribune', this Hon'ble Tribunal has issued notice dated 12.10.2023 to the Deputy Commissioner Faridabad and Haryana State Pollution Control Board about listing of the above subjected matter on 31.10.2023.
2. That Haryana State Pollution Control Board took the matter with the Deputy Commissioner, Faridabad for redressal of the grievance and necessary action through Municipal Corporation of Faridabad i.e. lifting & disposal of waste from the site in question.
3. That the Deputy Commissioner, Faridabad vide letter dated 18.10.2023 requested the Commissioner, Municipal Corporation

of Faridabad (MCF) to take immediate necessary action and submit Action taken Report.

4. That vide letter dated 30.10.2023 issued on behalf of the Commissioner, MCF to the Deputy Commissioner, Faridabad, it has been reported that “due to the breakdown of vehicles and insufficient deployment on the part of M/s Ecogreen, the BPTP transfer station became filled with garbage, resulting in a temporary accumulation of waste outside the transfer station. In response to this issue, Municipal Corporation Faridabad (MCF) took swift and proactive measures to address the problem. The actions taken by MCF include:

(i). Additional Resource Deployment & Garbage Lifted: To ensure the timely transfer of piled waste from the area, MCF deployed additional resources and vehicles. Specifically, four Hyva vehicles and two JCBS owned by MCF were mobilized to handle the accumulated waste.

(ii) Restoration: Currently, there is no waste dumped on the road portion in front of the transfer station. All the garbage accumulated under the bridge has been lifted and transported to Bandhwari site. The remaining garbage within and near the transfer station shall be systematically cleared and transported on a daily basis.”

5. That the MCF should ensure proper functionality of BPTP Transfer Station and waste should be immediately shifted to designated site on regular basis.


Subject: Status report for Suo Moto Notice dated 12.10.2023 regarding news item in Tribune dated 03.10.2023 entitled Faridabad residents see red over inefficient waste disposal.

In reference to the Suo Moto Notice dated 12.10.2023 regarding the news item published in The Tribune on 3rd October 2023, titled "Faridabad Residents See Red Over Inefficient Waste Disposal," this is to submit the status report to apprise the National Green Tribunal (NGT) of the current situation and the actions taken by Municipal Corporation Faridabad (MCF) in response to the concerns raised in the article.

The news article highlighted concerns regarding the inefficient waste disposal and management in Faridabad, with a particular focus on a photograph depicting a pile of garbage near the BPTP transfer station. This transfer station is managed by M/s Ecogreen Energy Gurgaon Faridabad Pvt. Ltd., the authorized Integrated Solid Waste Management (ISWM) concessionaire for the Gurgaon-Faridabad cluster. The mentioned site is situated in front of the BPTP transfer station, which is one of the six authorized transfer stations within MCF's jurisdiction. These transfer stations serve as temporary storage points for the Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) collected from residential, commercial, and institutional units within the MCF limit. The BPTP transfer station caters to a population of more than 1.5 lakhs in the adjoining 4-5 wards. The total quantum of waste transported to Bandhwari site via the BPTP transfer station is approximately 100-125 Tons Per Day (TPD).

However, due to the breakdown of vehicles and insufficient deployment on the part of M/s Ecogreen, the BPTP transfer station became filled with garbage, resulting in a temporary accumulation of waste outside the transfer station. In response to this issue, Municipal Corporation Faridabad (MCF) took swift and proactive measures to address the problem and prevent further inconvenience to the public. The actions taken by MCF include:

1. **Additional Resource Deployment & Garbage Lifted:** To ensure the timely transfer of piled waste from the area, MCF deployed additional resources and vehicles. Specifically, four Hyva vehicles and two JCBs owned by MCF were mobilized to handle the accumulated waste.
2. **Restoration:** Currently, there is no waste dumped on the road portion in front of the transfer station. All the garbage accumulated under the bridge has been lifted and transported to Bandhwari site. The remaining garbage within and near the transfer station shall be systematically cleared and transported on a daily basis.
